# A Note on Today's ReadingsProper 25: Sunday closest to October 26—Year C

Welcome to our worship service today. The gospel reading in the liturgy today has to do with our approach to God in prayer. It is not the proud Pharisee's bragging prayer but the humble confession of the sinner which brings God's response.

We continue to read through the prophets, which we began doing in June. Now we hear from Joel, who lived well after the time of Jeremiah. Joel rejoices in God's goodness and the blessings the Lord has given them. He says that in the days to come God will also pour out the Spirit upon the people and all who call on God will be saved.

The second reading is presented as Paul's final words to Timothy when Paul was in prison and facing his imminent death. That approaching martyrdom finds Paul confident in the good he has done, but, like the tax collector, he is aware of his total dependence upon God.

We, the community of faith, are put into right relationship with God not because of our success being good, but because we place our whole trust and confidence in God. We strive to give up all and follow Jesus not in order to earn God's favor, but as our response to the unswerving love God has for us.

# **Episcopalians invited to first Veterans Day Holy Eucharist** and Commissioning of Chaplains

Episcopalians are invited to join a first-time churchwide Veterans Day Holy Eucharist service at **7 p.m. ET Nov. 11**—via <u>livestream</u> or in person at the Church Center chapel in New York City—to honor those who have served in the military and specially recognize the Episcopal chaplains who support them.

Presiding Bishop Sean Rowe will preside, and the Rt. Rev. Ann Ritonia, bishop suffragan for the church's <u>Armed Forces and Federal</u>
<u>Ministries</u>, will preach. The service will include a special "commissioning for further service" of chaplains who serve military veterans in all branches of the U.S. Armed Forces.

#### "Relief"

The images and news from the Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta in the wake of typhoon Haplong are devastating. While I am thankful that our villages along the Lower Yukon and the Chukchi Sea did not experience the same levels of destruction as communities like Kipnuk and Kwigillingnok, I ask all of us in the Diocese of Alaska to remain persistent in prayers for these our siblings in Christ, and to consider contributing to the relief efforts in the hardest hit areas.

The Diocese of Alaska has pledged \$2,000 to the Western Alaska Disaster Relief Fund through the Alaska Community Foundation.

I am grateful for the response from Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD), who contacted me to ask how ERD might assist with relief efforts. Since we do not have any established church contacts in the Y-K Delta, it is difficult for ERD to work directly with needs in the area. I suggested that ERD partner with the Alaska Community Foundation in support of the Western Alaska Disaster Fund.

ERD is now also aware of the flooding and potential relief and recovery needs in Kivalina and Kotzebue from the first storm that blew through

Northwestern Alaska three days before typhoon Haplong. I am waiting to hear from Kivalina and Kotzebue after they have an opportunity to assess relief and recovery needs. The Diocese of Alaska and ERD stand ready to assist with direct support to those communities as requested and directed by their church and community.
