#### Dear Friends in Christ:

Currently our book group at St. Brendan's is reading a book by Katharine Hayhoe, Saving Us: A Climate Scientist's Case or Hope and Healing in a Divided World. Some of you may remember Dr. Hayhoe when she came to speak in Juneau a few years ago. If you heard her, I am sure you were struck by her graciousness, her communication skills and her kindness.

The book is about communicating about the climate crisis and engaging people in making changes in their lives. But more than that, Dr. Hayhoe stresses the importance of positive motivation, of making allies of the people we speak to, rather than inflicting shame and guilt on people who already suspect they could be making a better effort.

It occurs to me that engagement and creating partnerships is a means to accomplish much of what Christianity teaches. Making people feel bad because they are sinners rarely draws them closer to Christ, or makes them more virtuous. Telling people they don't give enough has never been an effective stewardship strategy. Accusing our fellow Christians of arrogance toward others is unlikely to induce humility in our interactions.

I like Dr. Hayhoe's approach of engaging others by her attitude of "we are all in this together." We are all sinners, dependent on grace. We all want to be generous and giving, and can strive in those directions together. We all want a community based on acceptance and mutual regard. And yes, we all want to do better in reducing our carbon footprints on "this fragile earth, our island home."

None of us have yet become the people we would like to be. None of us have reached the goals we strive for. All of us would like to become more loving, kinder, more thoughtful Christian believers. Imperfect as we are, we share this journey of becoming. So let's be kind to one another when we see each other stumble on the road. Most of all, let's be kind to ourselves.

Jesus loves us. Just as we are.

# **GENERAL ELECTION DAY – TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8**

Juneau voters can cast their ballots in this election in a variety of ways:

- In-person Voting at the polls on Election Day: Polls are open on Election Day, November 8, 7:00am to 8:00pm. Bring identification! You can vote if you are in line by 8:00pm when the polls close. Note: Due to redistricting, your polling place may have changed. Find your polling place at myvoterinformation.alaska.gov.
- In-person Voting before Election Day: Absentee In-Person and Early Voting is available beginning October 24. Find a location near you at elections.alaska.gov/avo.
- **By-Mail or Electronic Transmission Absentee Voting**: Anyone can vote from home by mail, fax or online delivery. You can still apply for an electronic transmission absentee ballot at absenteeballotapplication.alaska.gov. The deadline to apply for a by-mail absentee ballot has passed, but other deadlines are listed below:
  - November 7 Deadline to apply for electronic transmission ballot
  - November 8 Postmark deadline for by-mail ballots

## **NOVEMBER OUTREACH PROJECT – MEALS ON WHEELS**

St. Brendan's Outreach project for November is Meals on Wheels (MOW).

MOW is part of Southeast Senior Services and delivers hot and nutritious meals to seniors 5 days a week. Many of the seniors being served are living on fixed incomes, and some are recovering from surgery, illness, or have disabilities that keep them homebound.

Currently 165 meals are being delivered each day. These meals are delivered by 61 regular and substitute volunteers, covering 12 routes a day throughout Juneau and Douglas. For more than 20 years, I have been one of these volunteers.

I have an assigned route in the Valley, and I deliver every Tuesday to about 12-15 people. It only takes me about 1 hour to deliver, but the good feelings associated with helping those in need last for a long time! Besides the food delivery, what a volunteer provides that is equally important is a safety check for those who may be living alone. Some elders to whom I deliver love to chat for a few minutes about grandchildren, pets or the weather, but many just smile, or say "thank you," or we wish each other a good day!

Meals on Wheels does receive some grant funds, but also relies heavily on donations from individuals to continue this essential service.

If you can, please consider donating through St. Brendan's to Meals on Wheels. Just write Outreach- MOW on the memo section of your check. If you would like to consider giving of your time also, the program can always use drivers on a regular or substitute schedule. There is also a need for people who can run the meals to and from town and St. Paul's Church in the valley.

# St. Brendan's Sign



The sign that has been sitting on the knoll to the right of the driveway to St. Brendan's was originally carved in 1988 by Donna Standerwick. This photo, a little blurry because it is photo of a photo, was originally placed on the edge of the property when construction was just beginning.

Over the years the sign has been stained, painted, and become weather worn.



At a neighbor's house for dinner I met up with Rai (Ray) Behnert. Through conversation I found that Rai liked to carve. I mentioned that St. Brendan's had a sign that was in need of refurbishing. He said he would take a look at it and let me know if he was interested. By the end of May Rai had decided that he would like to take on the project. We had to get through summer and the sign delivered the sign to Rai in mid August.

I received a text from Rai the end of September letting me know that he had, through research of St. Brendan made a few enhancements, was putting the last coat of urethane on the sign, and would be ready for pick up. Jeff Fujioka and I picked up the sign on October 2.
